0:15		Kingston, Ontario	“Olympia Billiards and Restaurant Take-out” was at 63 Charles Street across from the No-Frills grocery store.
0:45			There were six billiard tables and at the front entrance there was the take-out. They offered fish and chips, hamburgers, fries, soft drinks and milkshakes.
1:05			At the beginning Peter ran the business with a co-owner named Dimitrios Kouris and later with another co-owner named Constantinos Bourgiotis.
1:53			Peter was a very tough boss. He didn’t want any help from anyone. He had few nick-names, calling him dictators.
2:17			He didn't have any problem with anybody, nor with the police. He just wanted things to be done very specifically and to protect his own business.
3:00			At the beginning, the billiards part had a higher profit. Later, the restaurant part became more profitable.
3:30			Peter met his wife through a photo. A friend sent him a photo of her from Greece. He invited her to Canada and they got married.
4:25			It was a hard job. He worked from 7 am to 11pm.
4:35			Peter has 2 sons (Spiros, Apostolos) and 1 daughter (Sofia). It was a little hard to run a business and have a family, because he worked many hours. It opened at 7am and closed at 10pm.
